- An academic honesty pledge is used by many nurse educators

Copyright Laws

- Copyright laws protect original pieces of authorship
- Best practice is to put journal articles in the online courseroom when permission is granted or use permalinks
- Most publishers will grant permission to use
- (Wittmann-Price, Godshall, & Wilson, 2017)
