





A Concise Introduction to Logic is an introduction to formal logic suitable for undergraduates taking a general education course in logic or critical thinking, and is accessible and useful to any interested in gaining a basic understanding of logic. This text takes the unique approach of teaching logic through intellectual history; the author uses examples from important and celebrated arguments in philosophy to illustrate logical principles. The text also includes a basic introduction to findings of advanced logic. As indicators of where the student could go next with logic, the book closes with an overview of advanced topics, such as the axiomatic method, set theory, Peano arithmetic, and modal logic. Throughout, the text uses brief, concise chapters that readers will find easy to read and to review.

The presentation of concepts and principles is orderly, clear and thought provoking. 

5 Steps

Evidence-Based Practice

PICO(T) is a mnemonic format for use in formatting evidence-based practice questions. Keep reading to learn the five components the mnemoic stands for! In this Infographic, PICOT is described and tips for writing a PICOT are presented! Scroll down to the end.

Patient population or patient condition of interest: The patient population or patient condition of interest should be described. It is important to know and explain the population and condition carefully so that the project, including evidence used is based on this group (Schmidt & Brown, 2015). For example, heart disease management for females should not be based on research done with males.

Intervention of interest: Evidence found during the literature review should match and provide
